

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

"For a long time after that summer, the four Penderwick sisters still talked of Arundel. Fate drove us there, Jane would say. No, it was the greedy landlord who sold our vacation house on Cape Cod, someone else would say, probably Skye. Who knew which was right?

In this crazy, unpredictable time we live in, visits to the movie theater have ceased to be common occurrences. However, the opportunity to

spend more time with your nose in a book has increased dramatically. Thus, many of my reviews have switched focus to recommend great read-alouds that can entertain the family while not wasting too many brain cells. So here is the beginning of a series that brings the very best adventure, laughs, and tears all at once. - *The Penderwicks* by Jeanne Birdsall.

Two weeks at a magnificent mansion with a crabby owner plus four lively, unsupervised sisters and a lovable (if not slobbery) dog named Hound. What could go wrong? The caring beauty of Rosalind, the rambunctious energy of Skye, the dreamy writer, Jane, and the animal-loving Batty can't be more thrilled to be on vacation at #11 on Stafford Street. Exploring the extensive estate can't entice them more, especially when they meet the proprietor's son, Jeffery. Unfortunately, his mother, Mrs. Tifton, isn't so excited about the Penderwick girls' presence on her property. Staying out of trouble isn't as easy as it looks, however, and thus begins a hilarious series of adventures starring the interesting personalities of Rosalind, Skye, Jane, Jeffrey, Batty, and Hound. The bonds of friendship and family, plus the cheerfulness of the distracted botanist that is the Penderwicks' father seem to get them through every trial. Endless laughs are easily supplied by Skye's funny quips, as well as her less-than-gentle splashes of reality. The plot thickens when their friend Jeffrey needs their help, and the sympathetic sisters are torn between loyalty to Jeffrey their promise to stay out of trouble. This heartwarming comedy brings out the best in exploits gone wrong.

This first book in one of my favorite series had me crying with laughter at every chapter and was an exceptional picture of family charm and adventure. It is a reading level of about 8-12 years but is still perfect for younger ones as well. I have no negative comments on this book but enjoyed it thoroughly. The characters are relatable and fascinating alike, and the plot is just as beautifully timeless as the rest of it. I give this book five stars.



What is your favorite part about living in your neighborhood? The walking trails, playgrounds, pool and access to the Lake are the amenities that we enjoy the most in Overlook.





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

Silas is very attached to his humans. In fact, we often joke that we should wear orange vests and be his emotional-support humans.



Investment Lessons from 2020

As the year draws to a close, it's fair to say that we've all learned something about the social, political, physical and environmental forces that have affected everyone. And, in some ways, our lives will be changed, perhaps permanently. But as an investor, what lessons can you learn from 2020?

Here are some to consider:

• The markets look ahead. Here's something many investors discovered in 2020: Investment prices don't always move in the same direction as the overall economy. This might not have seemed apparent right after the COVID-19 pandemic struck in mid-February, as the overall economy and the stock market took big hits. But just about five weeks later, the markets began a rally that lasted several months. During this time, the economy also recovered somewhat, but still remains on weak footing.

What can explain this discrepancy between the markets and economic activity?

Essentially, economic numbers, such as the unemployment rate and gross domestic product (GDP), reflect what's happening today, but the markets are always looking toward tomorrow, which means they are anticipating a stronger economic recovery and the results that come with it, such as greater corporate earnings in 2021. No one can say for sure what the future holds, but you can usually know the market's opinion by its performance.

· Opportunities will always exist for investors. Although the coronavirus seems unprecedented, the equity markets have rebounded from many crises before it. From war to global financial meltdowns, the market has seen it all. But even at the height of these events, when the markets might be most affected, individual segments or industries can do well.

For example, in the current environment, when many people have been forced to work and shop from home, and get their entertainment online, it's probably not surprising that some parts of the technology sector have seen their economic activity grow, along with their stock prices. Here's the key point: Investment opportunities always exist, especially in times of market stress and smart investors will find them and incorporate them into their portfolios in a way that's appropriate for their goals and risk tolerance.

· Patience and discipline can pay dividends. As mentioned above, the stock market dropped sharply in the weeks immediately following the pandemic, but then gained steadily for months afterward. Investors who tried to "cut losses" and exited the market likely did so at the wrong time and missed out on the beginning of the upturn. Unfortunately, this is not uncommon - investors who overreact to market declines often find themselves on the investment sidelines just when a new rally begins. Rather than being reactive in this way, you may be better off sticking with a long-term investment strategy, and buying and selling investments only when it makes sense for your situation, such as when you need to diversify your portfolio.

For many reasons, it's unlikely that we'll see anything exactly like 2020 again. But some of the investment lessons we learned are applicable in every year, so keep them in mind for 2021 and beyond.

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resident recipe

These are really fun and easy to make. You can make it as fancy or as simple as you want. If you want to try piping them, make sure you have a big tip and set up your piping bag beforehand, so that it doesn't get too hard to pipe.

Ingredients

- 1. 3 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 2.1 teaspoon peppermint extract
- 3.3 cups powdered sugar, sifted
- 4. food coloring-optional

Directions

Using a mixer, cream the cream cheese until smooth, add in extract and food coloring if using. Cream again till light and fluffy. Slowly add in powdered sugar, make sure to scrape down sides of mixing bowl. Once all sugar is added and well combined, roll dough into teaspoon sized balls. Place balls on wax paper lined tray, Use a fork to flatten. If your dough is sticky, you can roll them in powdered sugar first. Let mints dry for 12 hours then turn mints over to let bottom side dry. Store in an airtight container at room temperature. Mints will keep for at least a week.
